Message from President Myrna



Together with some 3300 sisters in faith, your Grand Canyon synod women were well represented at the 2017 Triennial Gathering Minneapolis on July 13-16, 2017 under the theme of "All Anew." My thanks to Randi VenHuizen for her Triennial reflections which incorporated into this News. There were opportunities to hear powerful speakers,

worship, participate in servant events, tours, visit the Exhibit Hall, attend workshops, connect with old friends and meet new as we fellowshipped and learned together. The Gathering's renewal theme offered many opportunities to consider how we are being changed. We were challenged to see the world with new eyes, to sense the needs of our neighbors in a new way.

Following our Opening Worship on Thursday afternoon and then a reception to "meet the Bishop," we had our first plenary session. Kelly Fryer (author of our summer Gather Bible study) told us "we're daughters of a troublemaker." She said we're called to follow Jesus' example of standing with those on the margins. Bishop Eaton led a panel responding to Kelly's message. On Friday, Nobel Peace Prize winner Leymah Gbowee reminded us that "anew" isn't an event, it's a process. Jesus renews us daily to do his work. Friday and Saturday gave us an opportunity to attend a mid-day organ recital at Central Lutheran Church. The afternoons were filled with workshops to attend, servant events to participate in, and choir practice if you sang in the triennial choir.

Friday evening included a film screening, "Beauty of our Dreams," a documentary about what faith groups are doing to support girls' education globally. The film focuses on spiritual communities and individuals motivated by faith to help all girls have the chance to learn. It also explores why religious institutions often neglect the need to educate girls. Those who attended this film screening found it educational and inspiring.

Saturday early morn kicked off with the 5K Run, Walk and Roll in Loring Park. Some 300 of us turned out to get some exercise and raise money for churchwide's Raising Up Healthy Women and Girls initiative. In our Saturday plenary session, The Rev. Alexia Savatierra examined systems that should be challenged, asking what counter-cultural, justice



making action we are being called to take. reminded us that, as Lutheran Christian women, we're good at mercy. But that is no longer enough. We need to get out of our pews and move into A Q&A session followed her justice work. Saturday afternoon was more presentation. workshops, servant events, visiting to the Exhibit In the evening, another film screening, "Dreamcatchers," was shared. This features a former Chicago prostitute, Brenda Myers-Powell, co-founder and executive director of a charitable organization that helps women and teenage girls leave the sex industry and breaks the cycle of abuse and exploitation. Saturday evening also provided those with tickets to listen to the National Lutheran Choir perform at Central Lutheran Church.

In our closing worship on Sunday morning, presided over by The Rev. Barbara Lund, director of Wisdom Ways Center for Spirituality in St. Paul, MN, The Rev. Angela Khabeb from Ascension Church in Waukesha, WI, warned us that if we're comfortable in Jesus, we're doing it wrong. One of her quotes, "When we've got God all figured out, we are in a very dangerous place. Because our God is big. Our God is the alpha and the omega, the beginning and the end — and the middle, too, just in case there was any confusion. God's word teaches us that the clouds of the air are the dust of God's sandals. That's a big doggone God." She reminded us that the God of the universe blesses everyone. Rev. Khabeb received a standing ovation following her sermon!

Can we continue the momentum experienced at the Triennial Gathering? Are we ready for "all anew?" Can we work to bring about change so sorely needed in our communities, in our society, in our world? Can we set free old, outdated ideas and encourage new growth? Whose corner are we being called to stand in?

As we go forward, carrying the inspiration and momentum of this Triennial experience, be encouraged by the words from Isaiah 43:18-19 - "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."





myself permission to check out, rest and reflect. After all, God rested at the end of His creation (Genesis 1:2-3).

2017 Triennial Convention Notes from Myrna Wells-Ulland

Your Grand Canyon Synod women were represented at the 2017 Triennial Convention in Minneapolis by myself, as president, and by Susan Girouard from Community Lutheran in Las Vegas and Randi Ven Huizen from Spirit of Joy in Gilbert. This convention was the first for both Susan and Randi. We were joined by 300 other voting members from across all synods of our ELCA. Convention proceedings were spread over four plenary sessions and began with a communion service. Business included electing new officers and board members to the churchwide (CWO) executive board. Elections for the CWO president and vice president were from an ecclesiastical/nominating ballot. Laura Krueger, your former GC synod women's president, was one of 17 elected to the CWO board. I chaired the Conduct of Elections Committee. We also heard reports from outgoing CWO president, Patti Austin; from Linda Post Bushkofsky, Executive Director of Women of the ELCA; from our Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, Rev. Elizabeth Eaton; from Ely Smith, Treasurer of the CWO executive board, and others. The budget for 2018 was reviewed and approved. The audit report was reviewed and approved. We were introduced to three new websites which I hope you will visit and enjoy: the CWO's redesigned website at www.gathermagazine.org and Café, the online magazine focused on younger women but read by all ages at www.boldcafe.org.

Changes to the Constitution were approved, basically modifying verbiage from "voting members of the ELCA" to "voting members of an ELCA congregation." An approved constitution change affecting all synodical women's organizations is the requirement:

To distribute pre-convention reports to all voting members at least 20 days prior to our conventions.

We also affirmed the ELCA's repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery, adopted by the August 2016 churchwide assembly of the ELCA, including educating ourselves about this statement and its consequences for Native people in North America and continuing to develop relationships with American Indians and/or Alaskan Native ministries within or near our synods, including practicing accompaniment with native peoples instead of a missionary endeavor to them. Churchwide will post this full Resolution on its website. We discussed and voted on several memorials (resolutions coming from synodical conventions) and resolutions (motions coming from the floor), summarized below. Many of these actions impact what we will be involved with in this next triennium and your GC synod women's board will be encouraging that discussion and involvement.

Memorials to Support the TDTR (Today's Dream, Tomorrow's Reality) Network (our anti-racism emphasis) were sent back to the CWO executive board for further consideration. These memorials were defeated, however, it asked that we invite the TDTR team to meetings and events to present programs about racism, that we establish a line item for such programming in our budget, that churchwide provide funding, training and programs to assist this action, and that we report back to the 2019 Conference of Presidents about actions taken within our SWOs. TDTR is a long standing program of churchwide; I'm not sure if we have any trained presenters in our GC synod. If we do, please let me know.

A memorial **Regarding Tainted Water in Flint, Michigan** was adopted. This memorial came from the New England SWO and addresses the contamination of the Flint River. The memorial resolves **encourage** all of us as Women of the ELCA to affirm the need for clean water for the people of Flint, Michigan by raising awareness and/or offering tangible support to the people of Flint and requests that each synodical women's organization report on actions taken at the 2019 Conference of Presidents.

A memorial to **Reduce the Size of Synodical Boards** was rejected. This resolution wanted to amend the Constitution and Bylaws for SWOs by lowering the number of elected board members to three.

A memorial **Condemning All Forms of Corporal Punishment** was adopted. This memorial came from the NE lowa SWO and **asks Women of the ELCA to support the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child by stating clearly that it condemns all forms of corporal punishment of children (hitting, kicking, shaking, throwing, pinching, pulling hair, burning or scalding, etc.) and requests that each synodical women's organization report on actions taken to raise awareness of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child at the 2019 Conference of Presidents.** This memorial notes that while the US has signed the UN Conventions of the Rights of the Child, it is the only UN member state in which it has not been ratified.

A memorial Regarding Domestic Abuse and Violence and its Prevention was adopted. This memorial came from the NW Wisconsin SWO and encourages us to continue to educate ourselves about domestic abuse and the services available in our communities, and to act by choosing from a list of options included in the resolution. We are also requested to report back on what we've done to continue to raise awareness of domestic violence at our 2019 Conference of Presidents.

A memorial Regarding Bible Women Ministry of India was adopted. This memorial came from NW MN SWO and encourages us to hold in prayer the Bible Women of India as it ministers to families in India and to affirm the efforts of the NW Minnesota Synodical Women's support of the Bible Women of India.

Resolutions that came from the floor included a resolution to **Act to End Human Trafficking**. **Actions** include holding January 11 through February 2, 2018 as a time of prayer to end human trafficking (prior to the 2018 Super Bowl), that we use resources such as the ELCA's Cherish All Children's mission model, that we continue to educate ourselves and others about warning signs of being trafficked and resources available to us, that we connect with others fighting human trafficking including Lutheran Social Services, and that we report on actions taken at the 2019 Conference of Presidents.

Another resolution, Go Green 2020, was adopted, encouraging participants at the 2020 Triennial to bring along their portable devices to download convention materials and to bring reusable coffee mugs and fillable water bottles.

A resolution developed by our own Phyllis Borchardt from Spirit of Grace in Surprise and presented from the floor by your voting delegation to Engage Women of the ELCA in Supporting Leadership Needs in the ELCA was also adopted. This resolution recognized the "retirement tsunami" of pastors upon us in the ELCA in the near future. It encourages us to pray for and lift up women who might seek ordination or seminary education. It also asks us to lift up support for the ELCA Fund for Leaders (a merit-based scholarship program) to raise up and financially support students studying at ELCA seminaries who demonstrate leadership potential and gifts for ministry.

Another resolution, Supporting a Responsible Energy Future and Care for Creation, was adopted. This requests that we continue to learn about and advocate for a carbon fee and dividend, and other measures such as solar power, to care for God's creation.

A resolution on the Number of Board Members from a Congregation (set as up to 2 women) was a request for a review by the Constitutional Review Committee of the CWO Executive Board, since it would require a constitutional change and require two readings (meaning it has to come to two Triennial Conventions). This resolution was adopted.

Finally, Susan and Randi (with Laura Krueger's help) distributed some 350 of our "2020—See You in Phoenix" luggage tags, inviting women to come to Phoenix in 2020 for the next Triennial. The Triennial Convention is the "business" portion of the Triennial experience and it is the highest legislative authority of our Women of the ELCA. We will again be electing voting members for the 2020 Triennial at our next GC synod women's convention in the fall of 2018. (This is because we won't have another convention before the summer of 2020.) Our voting delegation strives to include a woman of color or whose primary language is other than English, a first-timer, and your synod women's president, who is an automatic representative for you. The number of voting members is determined by the number of "active units" within our GC synod. We have some work to do to increase our number of active units, allowing us to elect 3 voting members at our 2018 convention. In 2017, we had 48 "active units" on the churchwide roster. If we get to 51-75, we can add one more voting member. The number of voting members increases by each increment of 25 active units in the synod.



What is an active unit? At our recent convention in Las Vegas, the question came up about "active units." Some felt that unless you had a designated "circle/circles" in your congregation, you aren't considered an active unit. That is no longer the case. The Women of the ELCA are an integral part of the ELCA. We are the women's ministry arm of the ELCA. and we continue to partner in all areas to extend our shared growth and development as a church worldwide. Our bonds as Women of the ELCA have their roots in our foundation, the church unit. As individual units we come together to form our nine conferences, our synod (Grand Canyon), participate in our region (2), and then our churchwide organization. But what does it mean to be a unit, and therefore, an active unit?

A unit is defined by our constitution as having four required components:

- 1. the unit's women come together for study, support, and action
- 2. the unit's women participate in the ministry of the Women of the ELCA beyond the congregation
- 3. The unit designates one person in the unit as a contact person to be in communication with both the synod women's organization and churchwide, and
- 4. the unit supports financially the total program of Women of the ELCA (at the synod and/or churchwide through regular and special offerings)

Purpose Statement:

As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and

empowered by the Holy Spirit, We commit ourselves to

grow in faith,

affirm our gifts,

support one another in our callings,

engage in ministry and action, and

promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world.

Women ELCA

When all four components are met, the unit is designated as an "active unit." Each active unit has a vote in all synod matters and sends a voting member to participate in the business of the synod women's organization. Additionally, at our national Triennial Convention, the number of voting members from each synod are assigned based upon the number of active units within the synod. So our synod voice is strengthened with more active units. Currently, our Grand Canyon synod has the minimum number of voting members (2) plus your president to our Triennial conventions. If there were more active units within our synod, we may have the opportunity to increase our number of voting members to the next Triennial, which will be in Phoenix in 2020.

Each unit has the opportunity to define itself in your organizational structure. Your unit's constitution is the document that outlines how often you meet, what you do, and what your leadership looks like. Each unit can meet the needs of your women by tailoring itself to best meet the interest, location, resources, and unique talents of your Lutheran sisters. From Bible studies to Café groups to book study groups, to quilting to community service, to advocacy for those with

no voice and for justice issues, to congregational service and participation in local conference events, when two or more of you are gathered in His name (there is love), you could be an active unit.

Coming together as an active unit gives you a unique local place to share in Christ's love and gives you a voice in our Women of the ELCA. If you have any questions, please contact any of your board members whose contact information is always on the last page of the Canyon Echoes. If your unit would like help in organizing, re-organizing, or reenergizing your women's ministry, please contact us. Our president, Myrna Wells-Ulland, and our Vice-President, Suki Kisling, are willing to travel anywhere in our synod to engage in meaningful discussion with you about your women's ministry. Our goal: active units all across our synod!

If you want to bring new life to your church women, be sure at least one of your women is in attendance at the 2017 Triennial Gathering in Minneapolis in July. We will guarantee that any woman who attends will leave this event filled with new enthusiasm for, understanding of, and passion for Women of the ELCA ministry in her church. 
