Committee Reports

DISCIPLESHIP ... go and make disciples of all nations

The Discipleship committee has been discussing various way to encourage women to participate in Spring Gatherings, Conventions and Retreat. As always, it seems to be a COMMUNICA-TION problem! Among the many suggestions we are going to pursue, here is one we would like each of your leaders to accomplish. Each church office should have a mailbox marked for Women of the ELCA (WELCA) or Women's Ministries. Make sure the church secretary is aware that ALL mail pertaining to women should be inserted in this mailbox. Then make sure that someone checks the box on a regular basis and shares the information with other women in the congregation, be it through the church newsletter, bulletin boards (one church has put a bulletin board in the women's bathroom in order to reach their audience) or personal phone calls. On the flip side, if you are mailing out invitations to

other congregations, be sure to put "Attention WELCA" on the outside envelope.

We also encourage everyone to log on to our website (www.grandcanyonwomen.org) for all the latest information about what is going on around the Synod. You will also find issues of the Canyon Echoes, along with program ideas and skits you could use for Unit meetings. Check out Page 12 of this issue to find other web sites to motivate you in a positive direction. JUSTICE

On February 18th, 2017 the 3rd Annual Forum on Modern Day Slavery was presented by Green Valley/Sahuarita STOP Human Trafficking Task Force. There were a number of wonderful presenters and here are some of the highlights of the Forum.

Tammy Breitzke from DHS, I.C.E. in Tucson covered information on the structure of the SAATURN (Southern Arizona Anti-Trafficking Unified Response Network). This is a Department of Homeland Security Task Force for Law Enforcement and apprehension of traffickers. Tammy gave us invaluable information on resources/Hotlines where victims of trafficking can find safety and break away from the trafficker.

FACT: Human Trafficking is the fastest growing crime industry in the world ranking second only to illegal drugs. The Tucson Gem Show is a *Hotbed* for the Trafficker to find victims. It is 2nd only to the Super Bowl, and the Phoenix Car Show is a close runner up. If you encounter anything that just doesn't seem right

and/or you notice a child or adult that seems to be held against their will, your first action is call 911. The SAATURN Hotline is 520-837-2775, they will also have info on resources for the victim. There is also the National Human Trafficking Hotline.org 888-373-7888 or Text HELP or INFO to 233733.

"Chosen" a film which was produced by Shared Help International was shown. After which "Angie" a trafficking survivor, shared the horrors she endured for more than 20 years. She made us very aware that this is an issue happening in our own neighborhood.

STEWARDSHIP ...is what happens after you say "yes" to Jesus

Sometimes, it is about the money.....

The Merriam Webster dictionary's definition of Stewardship includes the words "the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care." Unfortunately, even with the best intentions by those entrusted with an organization's resources, sometimes those resources can become compromised.

According to an article published the Women of the ELCA, "Five Ways to Avoid E-mail Scams Requesting Money," found on their website (http://www.womenoftheelca.org/news--amp--announcements-pages-6.php), there have been recent reported cases where WELCA synodical organizations have been the victims of e-mail scams asking for money. The Treasurer will receive e-mails, presumably by the President, re-

questing money be wired. Often, the red flags that may arise with this go unheeded, and, consequently, money is lost.

Some organizations have lost a significant amount of money as a result. The article provides additional information on how the scam works and offers suggestions on how to avoid becoming a victim in this type of scam.

Your Synodical Board has very specific policies and procedures with respect to the care of the synodical gifts it receives from the various units, including requiring specific documentation prior to making any disbursements. We highly recommend that units review their own procedures to make sure their resources remain under the utmost care and out of the hands of scammers.



Women of the EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH IN AMERICA

What is an active unit? At our recent convention in Las Vegas, the question came up about "active units." Some felt that unless you had a designated "circle/circles" in your congregation, you aren't considered an active unit. That is no longer the case. The Women of the ELCA are an integral part of the ELCA. We are the women's ministry arm of the ELCA. and we continue to partner in all areas to extend our shared growth and development as a church worldwide. Our bonds as Women of the ELCA have their roots in our foundation, the church unit. As individual units we come together to form our nine conferences, our synod (Grand Canyon), participate in our region (2), and then our churchwide organization. But what does it mean to be a unit, and therefore, an active unit?

A unit is defined by our constitution as having four required components:

- 1. the unit's women come together for study, support, and action
- 2. the unit's women participate in the ministry of the Women of the ELCA beyond the congregation
- 3. The unit designates one person in the unit as a contact person to be in communication with both the synod women's organization and churchwide, and
- 4. the unit supports financially the total program of Women of the ELCA (at the synod and/or churchwide through regular and special offerings)

When all four components are met, the unit is designated as an "active unit." Each active unit has a vote in all synod matters and sends a voting member to participate in the business of the synod women's organization. Additionally, at our national Triennial Convention, the number of voting members from each synod are assigned based upon the number of active units within the synod. So our synod voice is strengthened with more active units. Currently, our Grand Canyon synod has the minimum number of voting members (2) plus your president to our Triennial conventions. If there were more active units within our synod, we may have the opportunity to increase our number of voting members to the next Triennial, which will be in Phoenix in 2020.

Each unit has the opportunity to define itself in your organizational structure. Your unit's constitution is the document that outlines how often you meet, what you do, and what your leadership looks like. Each unit can meet the needs of your women by tailoring itself to best meet the interest, location, resources, and unique talents of your Lutheran sisters. From Bible studies to Café groups to book study groups, to quilting to community service, to advocacy for those with

no voice and for justice issues, to congregational service and participation in local conference events, when two or more of you are gathered in His name (there is love), you could be an active unit.

Coming together as an active unit gives you a unique local place to share in Christ's love and gives you a voice in our Women of the ELCA. If you have any questions, please contact any of your board members whose contact information is always on the last page of the Canyon Echoes. If your unit would like help in organizing, re-organizing, or reenergizing your women's ministry, please contact us. Our president, Myrna Wells-Ulland, and our Vice-President, Suki Kisling, are willing to travel anywhere in our synod to engage in meaningful discussion with you about your women's ministry. Our goal: active units all across our synod!

If you want to bring new life to your church women, be sure at least one of your women is in attendance at the 2017 Triennial Gathering in Minneapolis in July. We will guarantee that any woman who attends will leave this event filled with new enthusiasm for, understanding of, and passion for Women of the ELCA ministry in her church. 

Cactus Conference Gathering

The Cactus Conference Women of the ELCA Gathering was held on Saturday, February 25, 2017 at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Sun City West, AZ. The theme of the Gathering was Love Your Neighbor...Who is My Neighbor? Morning refreshments were provided and served by Spirit of Grace Lutheran W-ELCA and coffee was provided and served by Lord of Life. Over 160 women attended.

Given recent Middle Eastern migrations into European communities, the continuing Hispanic migration into the US, and the recent heated discussions about our U.S. immigration policies, Winnie Fritz, MSN, Ed D, NEA-BC/CNAA and highly regarded public speaker, addressed our theme, Love Your Neighbor...Who is My Neighbor? The title of her talk and PowerPoint slides was, The Many Faces of God's Love – The Middle East and How Could We/ Should We Respond?




